




Trossachs Water Vole Project The real story!

- No water voles found but old burrows recorded.








Duchray Water 1993

2003






Duchray Water Restoration

- 1993 Forest Design Plan produced - complete restructuring of the Duchray zone and restoration of the river corridor. 40 year ongoing project.
- Conifers removed from riverbanks and burns
- Native trees planted
- New ponds and ditches
- Wetland species planted (locally sourced)
- Drains blocked to create new wetlands



Pulling together the Project partners
















Agreeing priorities not always easy - MOA! Forestry Commission reluctant to take the lead!




Project area & donor populations



From 60 voles to 1000+ is there a genetic problem?


2010/11 Wild voles caught Bred into the introduced Population – 112 voles

Mink Captures 2007-2017







Survey results





- Many new breeding sites have been naturally colonised up to 12km from release areas.
- New sites found every year since release now over 60 sites.
- •WVs now found in over 100 KM squares!
- Habitat assessments are ongoing and new suitable areas are surveyed each year.
