- The next Government should launch a cross-party delivery project to restore at least 30% of land and sea for nature.
- Expand native woodlands like Hareshaw Linn in Northumberland National Park to meet this goal.
- 🏅 Join-up wild places with a 'Nature Recovery Network'.
- Tackle invasive species like Himalayan balsam and stop planting non-native forests.
- Speed up the publishing a new Land Use Framework, Nature Recovery Green Paper and Chemicals Strategy.
- **%** Halve pesticide use by 2030.
- Ban the highly toxic neonicotinoid pesticide. One teaspoon is enough to kill 1.25 billion honeybees [3].
- Reintroduce beavers. They improve water quality, expand habitats for wildlife, and boost flood and drought resilience [4].
- End the badger cull by 2025. The scientific evidence tells us that it is ineffective and costs the taxpayer £5,000 per animal [5].
